Pastor's Corner

SOME THINGS

St. Benedict the Moor Education Commission has been established. At the last and fifth meeting on June 1, 2015, the Commission invited Brother Raymond Fitz, SM, who is the former President of the University of Dayton and Mrs. Susan Ferguson who is responsible for the Center for Catholic Education, University of Dayton, to come and highlight to the Commission the role that they have been playing and are playing to make St. Benedict the Moor a school of excellence. At that same meeting the Commission appointed Ms. Carolyn Day as the chair of the commission, Mr. Ron McDonald as the Vice and Ms. Lois Woods as the acting Executives until further notice. At this same meeting two committees were established; the Academic and Faith Formation Committee (Carolyn Day, Elsie Williams & Les Weller, Lois Wood), and the Marketing and Public Relations Committee (Ron McDonald, Carville Brown, Lois Woods). Another Committee needed which came up after the meeting was the Grants Committee (Cynthia Hayden & Janice Allen). These committee members will need your help in functioning and so I am asking for your support. If you are interested or can serve in any of the committees mentioned please approach these members and they will be more than welcoming you onto the committee. We are in this together as parish and a Region. Let us put our resources together and make St. Benedict the Moor Catholic School a School of Excellence.

PURPOSE

The Parish Education Commission is the basic unit for educational planning and policy making” according to the 1971 Archdiocesan Synod, It further states that “just as the Parish is next to the family, the basic unit of the Christian Community, so also the parish Education Commission is the basic unit for educational planning and policy making”.

Thus, the Parish Education Commission sees to it that the educational needs of everyone in the Parish and of students are being served. Per the Archdiocesan Handbook, the Parish Education Commission has the responsibility of determining the needs of the Parish/School Community in order to establish plans to meet these needs. The Parish Education Commission is a means by which the pastor can share his responsibility for educational policy-making and thus benefit from the knowledge and expertise of his parishioners. In other words, the purpose of the Commission is to advise the pastor in making policy for the parish educational programs. These programs include the school, the parish school of religion, and other formal educational activities.

FUNCTIONS

The Parish Education Commission serves in an advisory capacity to the principal of St. Benedict the Moor Catholic School and the Religious Educators of the Parish

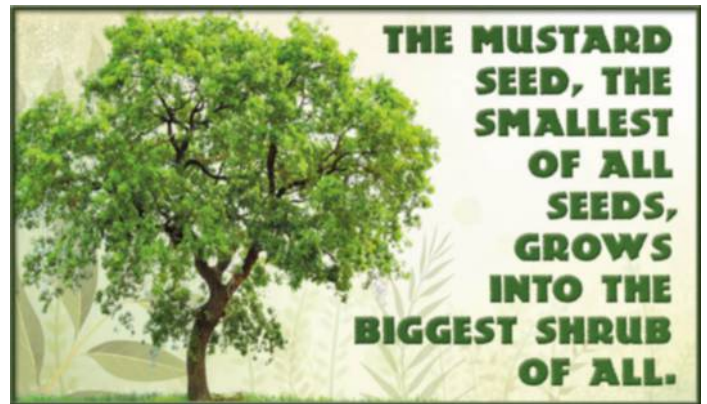
who, in turn, reports to the pastor regarding the education ministry of the parish. They meet the needs of the various groups in the parish by taking on several important functions. The primary functions of the Catholic School Advisory Commission are:

1. To promote the concept of lay ministry
2. To develop ownership and stability of the St. Benedict School and Parish Education for the future
3. To encourage strategic planning by establishing goals and objectives for itself
4. To offer financial advice
5. To develop, defend and evaluate policies. (This does not mean that the commission is the final “determiner” or “arbiter” of the policy).
6. To serve as a good public relations (marketing) source
7. To enable the principal to spend adequate time as an educational leader (calls for a regular evaluation of the administrator and teachers to be done by appropriate person, not by commission themselves)
8. To provide parents/guardians with a voice in their children’s education
9. Establishes a process for hiring and recommending administrative personnel.

RELATIONSHIPS WITH PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council establishes the Education Commission and therefore “structurally the Parish Education is an organ of the Parish Council... Nevertheless, for the sake of efficient operations, it seems appropriate that the Parish Education Commission enjoy certain independence and that its decisions be accepted without having to have everything explained a second or third time”. (Archdiocese of Cincinnati Education Commission Handbook, 1995).

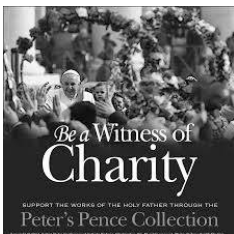
