Dear Holy Spirit Family of Parishes members,

I recently submitted our Year 2 Pathway Report to Archbishop Schnurr as part of the Beacons of Light (BOL) process. I want to share our progress with you.

Recall that BOL is a pastoral planning process to determine how best to use our five-church family of parishes' human, physical, and financial resources to come together as one canonical parish community. In 2021, we began our journey with the six BOL principles (Eucharist, Church, Leadership, Stewardship, Love In Action, and Evangelization) as our foundation.



What We Have Done

In January 2023, I established a unified pastoral Council with four Parish representatives. The Pastoral Council is a consultative body that advises the Pastor on pastoral issues. The council aims to investigate, reflect, and reach conclusions about pastoral matters to recommend to the Pastor.

Our Vision Statement: "We, the Holy Spirit Family of Parishes, will foster discipleship by making the Eucharist the center of our lives as we form, live, and share our faith."

What We Have to Do Next



We are beginning Phase Three (3): Creating an Ecclesial Culture around the Liturgy, Stewardship/Love In Action, and Evangelization.

Phase Three is about assessing our culture and then shaping it into what we want it to be. Our efforts will focus on bringing together, into one canonical community, all of our customs, beliefs, practices, and traditions to demonstrate how we live our faith. Our commitment to discipleship is essential to our Ecclesial Culture and how we live our faith.

There are three parts to creating our Ecclesial Culture (Kickoff Workshop led by the Archdiocese BOL Pathway Vitality team, Retreat to build discernment around creating an Ecclesial Culture, and discipleship formation throughout our Family of Parishes). With great intention, we will focus on discipleship formation and work towards bringing our family of parishes together into one canonical community. We will discuss and discern what type of canonical parish we want to be.

Members of the Leadership Team participated in the Archdiocese BOL Pathway "Phase 3 Kickoff" held at the University of Dayton in August 2024. A retreat will follow in early 2025. These two activities are to assist in discerning and defining our culture. As part of the upcoming Advent season exercise, members of the Leadership Team will facilitate discussions with our Family of Parishes on discipleship formation, using the Disciples Radiate Christ materials found on the Archdiocese BOL website. Four one-hour Advent sessions will be held each week at one of our five church sites. I encourage all to participate.

Later Phases



The last two BOL phases to come later are: 4) Collaboration on a strategic plan to identify action/steps (including timelines) to achieve our Vision and establish our culture; and 5) Implementation of the actions/steps that align with the Vision and enhance our culture to support

unity, vitality and missionary efforts. We will do this while valuing the diversity that makes our family of parishes unique. Remember, the phases can take many months to a couple of years. Our work will be ongoing and constantly evolving.
